Police Department Report: Chief Shawn Peters presented the police report for the month of January.

- Officers responded to a total of 272 calls for service for the month of January.
- Officers conducted a total of 48 traffic stops. Of those traffic stops, 12 citations were issued for traffic violations, 12 traffic crash reports were handled by officers. Of those crashes,2 were property damage and 8 included deer. There were 2 personal injury accidents and there were 2 arrests for operating while intoxicated.

- Chief Peters encourages residents to sign up for vacation house checks if they are going away for a weekend or south for the entire winter. There are currently 22 homes on the list.
