<u>Police Department Report</u>: Chief Peters presented the police report for the month of February, he reported the following,

- Officers responded to a total of 430 calls for service for the month of February.
- Officers conducted a total of 80 traffic stops. Of those traffic stops, 10 citations were issued for traffic violations, 8 traffic crash reports were handled by officers. Of those crashes, 7 were property damage and 1 resulted in personal injury. Officers arrested 1 driver for operating while intoxicated.
- Property crimes (Larceny/MDOP) remain low. A major factor in this is a visible presence of
 officers in the Twp & Village. I anyone sees something that raises suspicion they are
 encouraged to the contact Dryden Police or Lapeer County Central Dispatch.
- SRP Betts has been doing well keeping students and staff safe at both the Dryden JR/SR
 High School and the Dryden Elementary. His daily presence is invaluable to our community.
- With recent mild weather crashes have remained low this past month. Officers are doing a
 good job keeping the streets safe and making time each shift for active traffic enforcement.
- There have been many new changes as of February 13th, 2024 with Michigan Firearm Laws.

Firearms purchase permits will still be issued by the DTPD by appointment only on Tuesdays & Thursdays. Please call in advance to schedule a time if you need a permit. Metamora Two. Police is the only other local department providing this service to their community. All other residents in Lapeer County must go to the Lapeer County Sheriff's Office if they would like a permit.
